## ATTENTION: Boat Drivers, Judges & Scorers

Performance reports are a must if you plan on receiving credit for a tournament worked. It is the responsibility of each judge, scorer & boat driver to fill out a performance report after each tournament and submit it to the Chief Judge, Chief Scorer or Chief Boat Driver whatever the case may be. They are not going to do it for you! This is just part of your obligations as a judge, scorer or boat driver. I realize it is the last thing you want to do after the close of a long hot tournament but you must fulfill your obligation. This is a mandatory procedure for not only those people who are working towards a judgeship, scorer's rating or boat driver rating but also for those people who have already gained a rating for maintenance for their current rating. These graded performance reports are the only way we have to determine if you have worked the sufficient amount of tournaments to keep your current rating or to upgrade you. Please take the five extra minutes to fill out these performance reports so we don't lose any more judges, scorers or boat drivers in WISCONSIN.

# AWSA COUNCILMAN'S REPORT

Let me bring you up to date on what is happening to our Midwest Region. On February 12, 1983 we held our Mid-Winter meeting in Schaumburg, Illinois. Specific questions that I was instructed to ask follow with their answers.

1. Request of a page index for the Regional guide was approved.
2. Request for promo boat listings for the Regional Guide was approved.
3. Request club renewal membership applications be sent to all clubs. In a Newsletter received this week it states that all clubs were sent renewal notices. Nothing was mentioned however, about renewal notices for State Organizations.
4. It was brought out that the non-voting chairman of the Ski Show Committee was in essence voting by screening what material was sent to other committee members. The Council will request that the chairman copy committee members on all material and that he or a committee member attend Council meetings. We, the MWSEF, may also submit a recommendation to the Executive Vice-President next summer to represent the Midwest Region.
5. Nothing further has been done to alleviate lost paperwork for judges, scorers and drivers. It is strongly recommended that before you send in your renewal notice every two years that you ask AWSA Headquarters to send copies of the performance reports they have on file. If they are missing some, contact the Chief Judge of that tournament to see if he or she won't send another one in for you. Sorry, this is the best I can do. If you do run into trouble please inform me so I can also help you work this out.

Other points of interest brought out at the meeting follow:

Skiers fees (50¢ per skier) will be charged tournament sponsors again this year. All fees must be sent to your Councilperson within 60 days after your tournament or a late penalty of \$10.00 per month will be charged.

Scorers maintenance requirements were changed to the following:

Assistant Scorer must score 4 tournaments (all 3 events) over a 24 month period. Regular Scorers must score 2 tournaments (all 3 events) each 12 months.

There is a moratorium on rule changes for this year.

Since our meeting a few items have been brought to my attention.

The following towboats have been approved by AWSA to be used to pull AWSA sanctioned tournaments.

1. Mastercraft (351 c.i. Gear Box & Direct Drive)
2. Correct Craft 2001 (351 c.i.)
3. Ski Supreme (351 c.i.)
4. American Skier (351 c.i.)
5. The Dyme (175 hp outboard)

Towboat selection for Regionals and Nationals will be determined by the amount of use at local tournaments so it is advised that all tournament sponsors have as many boats available for use as possible.

The MWSEF has announced that two \$500.00 scholarships will be awarded for the 1983 school year. Applicants must be current members of either MWSEF or AWSA, incoming sophomore thru senior level students, and will have to meet scholastic achievement requirements. If you are interested applications are available from MWSEF, P.O. Box 2957, Winter Haven, Fla. 33883.

This year the United States Team auction will be held at the DuQuoin State Fairgrounds in DuQuoin, Illinois in conjunction with the Nationals. All proceeds from this auction go to the U.S. Team Fund. Any item of merchandise will be accepted. If you would like to contribute to the auction contact: Jim or Nancy Lauzon, 218 Hawthorne Court, Schaumburg, Ill. 60193

The most important item I need to address you on is AWSA membership. According to the by-laws of the Midwest Region, in order to elect a Councilperson you must have 10% or more of the Senior Membership in the Midwest Region. In State of Wisconsin does not have enough to qualify. I urge all of you to join AWSA so that we won't lose a voice in the Midwest Region. In the past we have found most of our members are 3 event related people. The Show Skiers of Wis. have never had to join AWSA to ski in any show tournaments and still don't, but we need your help now in securing a larger AWSA membership to support all water skiers in Wis. The 3 Event people have been pulling us along for many years but now all water skiers of Wis must support AWSA so that they can help you. Now that AWSA has sanctioned show tournaments, granted judgeship and scoring ratings, and taken over the upgrade and changes of show rules, we must be able to voice our opinions and we will not be allowed to do so if we don't have a large enough AWSA membership in Wisconsin to elect a Council person. **PLEASE** join today!!
